

The Banquet Bow And Buck


For those who missed the 2000 VBA Banquet, here is some food for thought. At the 1998 VBA Banquet, I entered the only bid in the silent auction for the PSE BABY G Force Bow. While it may have appeared that I was "stuck" with a bow that I didn't need, I worked through the setup and precise zero of the bow, found some Nitro Stinger carbon arrows that gave the bow outstanding performance, and proceeded with zeal into the 1999 Virginia bowhunting season. I'll admit I carried the bow for a long time before opportunity presented itself, but this was a hard year in many places in Virginia. The "Banquet Bow" and I toured a substantial part of Fairfax, Rockbridge and King George Counties together. We even faced down a 200-pound black bear together, but that is another story. On October 19, I was late getting into the Fort Belvoir woods. Preparing to warm the climbing tree stand for another long period, I finally settled in by 3:03 p.m. The setup was good, at 18 feet high, the scent was out and I set-

led back to wait. At 3:20 p.m. this bowhunt was all over. The nice four point buck appeared from my right well before expected. He checked my scent posts, stopped behind two large trees, allowing me to draw, and walked into my best shooting lane. I paused briefly to check for a better deer that might be following, and then perfected a sight picture. At 18 yards, the 60

pound bow drove the 85 grain Pro Series Thunderhead through both lungs, clipped the heart and in a complete passthrough severed the bone in his right leg. A wide bloodtrail led to the nearby creek and a major effort to "fish" him out for field dressing. At 110 pounds field dressed, he was as fat as they get on Fort Belvoir.

The Banquet Bow gave me the opportunity to harvest a "Banquet Buck." The rest of the season was quite uneventful. My bow and I teamed to miss another fine four point, but that was definitely not the fault of the bow. the buck has attended the State Indoor and Belvoir Banquet in the form of Chili and BBQ and many fine packages of venison remain. So take the opportunity to attend these major VBA and Club events. Get into the raffles; become involved; inspire others to participate. It could bring you the satisfaction of a great bowhunt and you can share it with us in future issues of *Flight*.

Everyone enjoyed guest speaker Bob Duncan. Bob is Director of the Wildlife Division for VDGIF.




Triple Crown winners, left to right: Les Goss, Darryll Diehl, Cay McManus, Paul Vogel and Chad Detwiler.









**Venison Liver Pâté
 With Madeira And
 Diced Ham**

- 6 Tbsp. butter
- 1/4 cup green onions, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped fine
- 1 lb. venison liver, cut 1" thick
- 1/4 cup Madeira or wine
- 4 thin slices ham, diced
- salt
- pepper

Melt the butter in a heavy skillet over medium heat. Add green onions and garlic and cook until just tender, not browned. Turn to high heat. Add venison liver and cook quickly until browned on all sides. Add the Madeira and stir to scrape up browned bits from the bottom of the skillet. Add diced ham and simmer for two minutes; then cool. Add salt and pepper. Put the mixture through a food grinder twice. Mold into a loaf and refrigerate. Serve at air temperature with assorted crackers.


