## From the Office of VBA Corresponding Secretary

Effective April 15, 1992, the NFAA handicap cards will be mailed directly to members from the NFAA headquarters in California. I will no longer be able to issue your NFAA handicap card when your club secretary sends your dues into the VBA office or issue duplicate cards if you lose or misplace your original. There seems to be an awful lot of confusion regarding the VBA ONLY MEMBERS. Club secretaries have been misinforming members who are VBA ONLY that they can shoot in sanctioned official round tournaments. Yes, clubs can allow a VBA ONLY member to shoot, but their scores are not put on their cards and THEY ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR AWARDS. You MUST have a NFAA handicap card and a VBA card to compete for awards. Let's get this situation straightened out. If VBA ONLY MEMBERS show an interest in competing, then let's also get them to pay their NFAA dues. I have been having all kinds of problems explaining to these people the opposite of what club officers are telling them. This is not only a VBA rule but is also a NFAA rule.

Also, club secretaries or tournament chairmen, please make a note that tournament reports for official rounds are to be mailed to the Corresponding Secretary the WEEK FOLLOWING YOUR SHOOT. I would also appreciate the Social Security number for all members, regardless of who they are, and remember to include the birthdate of all members under the age of 18.

Clubs and individuals having credits with VBA for overpayment of dues, 20pins or for whatever reason, be advised that these credits must be used up by the end of each calendar year or the money will go into the VBA treasury. When I took over this office, there were a few people who have credits that go back a couple of years; so if you do (and you have been notified), please remember to use them or lose them!




#### In Memoriam-Nina Enders





Another date change! The date for the 1992 3-D National Championship will be August 22, 23, 1992.







# BOW

BOW. The chief weapon of the early American Indian. Bows were made from many types of springy woods, as well as from bone and horn, and were of different lengths and shapes. The Indian prized his bow and took good care of it, keeping. it unstrung and in a bow case when not in use. Even after he had acquired firearms, he usually carried his bow whether in war or on the hunt. There were four general types of bows in use by the Indians. One was the self-bow, made of one long length of wood, popular with the eastern Indians. Then there was the compound bow, made of several layers of wood, bone, or horn, glued and lashed together, used by some Plains tribes. The third was the sinew-wrapped bow, made of a brittle wood which was wrapped from wing to wing with sinew. This bow was used among the Alaskan tribes. The last type was the sinew-backed self-bow strengthened by a strip of sinew or rawhide, glued and lashed to the back of the bow, much used by the California tribes. The Eskimo made a bow out of whales' ribs, set on a wooden grip.

The North Pacific tribes used a short bow with flat wide wings and a round grip. The Florida Indians' bow was as long as the height of a round grip. The Fiorina indians bow was as iong as the neight of the man who used it. Bows of the Plains Indians were shorter than most, as they usually were shot from horseback. Some Plains tribes, as well as the Apache, bent back the tips of the wings in the shape of

as well as the Apache, bent back the ups of the wings in the shape of a cupid's bow. Pueblo Indians made small painted bows to be used in religious ceremonies and to be buried with the dead. Removement and of the Opera counter (hole free) found Bows were made of the wood of the Osage orange (bois darc), found west of the Mississippi, ironwood, second growth hickory, cedar, dog-

ood, white ash, and mulberry. Indians learned the use of the bow from childhood. Many stories have been told of how Indians could shoot four or five arrows, one wood, white ash, and mulberry. after the other, before a man could reload his gun. When the Spanish conquistadores found that an arrow would go through a coat of isn conquistances round that an arrow would go through a coat or mail they adopted as armor the quilted cloth of the Mexican Indians. These tests showed: Osage bow, 92 yards; Apache bow, 120 yards; Blackfoot bow, 145 yards; Cheyenne bow, 165 yards; Yaqui In-dien bow (from Maxico), 910 wards. English long hour 950 wards yarus; Diackiuur uuw, 140 yarus; Oneyenne oow, 100 yarus; 14qui dian bow (from Mexico), 210 yards; English long bow, 250 yards.
